### **PURPOSE**

To inform the Village Council on discussions regarding the isolated St. Mary's Street water runoff concern.

### **OVERVIEW**

Several years ago, the Village embarked on a mission to provide additional on street parking in various areas of our community. In doing so, the decision was made to eliminate the grass buffer strip between the roadway and sidewalks, that acts as zone of infiltration for street water runoff. In some cases, these areas were converted decades ago and have for the most part continued with limited concern. However, in other areas they apparently are no longer able to contain the runoff. In this particular case, a small section of St. Mary's Street has generated isolated, yet consistent complaints.


On April 8, 2025, the General Service committee reviewed three design scenarios to begin the discussion on this section of on street gravel parking. From a short-term solution perspective, the committee agreed that the most cost-effective short-term solution would be to convert the perpendicular parking area to parallel parking.

On October 7, 2025, this topic was once again placed on the agenda to discuss narrowing the scope. However, due to a lack of quorum we canceled the meeting. To clarify, following its cancelation, staff provided an overview of the report to the residents present and addressed their questions as it related to this topic and others.

### STAFF COMMENT

Staff has periodically observed this area when rain was present and although observations have resulted in limited concern, variables are present to suggest a runoff issue *could potentially* occur during a higher volume rainfall. The addition of a "grassy swale" should minimize this potential.

In summary, there is approximately 24 feet of gravel and asphalt extending from the edge of the travel way to the edge of sidewalk. Approximately ½ (12-feet) of the gravel parking area would be replaced by a vegetative grass strip. The remaining (approximately) 12-feet would be transitioned into parallel parking. Although we are still in the discover/strategize phase, we wanted to update the Council of this discussion.

Subject:	Managers Update				

Although we are preparing our equipment, infrastructure and amenities for the winter months, our focus is steadfast on accomplishing our 2025 projects. Below we have provided you with a quick update on various tasks, projects and plans. As you are aware, this list does not address all of our active projects, however, these are a few projects that are currently in the works.

### MARINA "A-DOCK" PROJECT - (GRANT)

The EGLE permit public hearing process has concluded as of October 9, 2025 with no comments received. This permit is still in the review phase at the State level however we have addressed all questions and are on track to receive our "A Dock" project permit in the near future. Stay tuned...

### BOATERS SERVICE AND PUBLIC RESTROOM PROJECT- (GRANT)

This project is in final engineering/architectural phase and we anticipate moving forward with bid proposals in January.

### SHORELINE RESTORATION – (GRANT)

A few months ago, we submitted a shoreline remediation grant in partnership with the Watershed Center for the Coal Dock Park. This grant would allow us to create a unique method of shoreline erosion control while also creating an aquatic habitat. The idea was presented to State of Michigan officials and received high praise at the time. We will keep you posted on the status of our request.

### EGLE SOURCE WATER PROTECTION - (GRANT)

We received an updated from EGLE regarding the status of our Source Water Protection Grant, that we applied for in June of this year. Due to budgeting issues and delays at the state and federal levels, grant awards have been delayed, likely until 2026. EGLE is non-committal on if this delay and potential reduction in funds will affect the competitiveness of this grant, however, it is likely. Stay tuned...

### ELM STREET PROJECT

The (Phase II) repaying project on Elm Street is scheduled to begin in the next few days, weather depending. This project will address the long-time drainage issues, 1st street ramp, sunken asphalt and catch basin improvements. The road will be closed for approximately a week with detours being incorporated during that time. Outside of a minor inconvenience, we do not anticipate any traffic delays, or backups for school traffic.

### ELM STREET SIDEWALK PROJECT

We have received high praise from leaders and worshippers of the St. Michaels Church for our sidewalk replacement project. With raingarden improvements and another sidewalk project planned for this area in 2026, we will be able to address a few long-planned projects.

### LAW ENFORCEMENT

We are in the process of finalizing a law enforcement contract that is set to expire December 31st. The extension will be for one year; however, we will be discussing a longer-term contract extension in July.

### **JACOBS**

Similar to the law enforcement contract, we are finalizing a one-year contract extension for the WWTP operator. We will be discussing a longer-term contract extension in the coming months.

### TREE CUTTING

We will be eliminating several street trees over the next few weeks, that have exceeded their lifespan. These trees are located throughout the village (St.Marys, Broadway etc) and will be replaced with new trees in 2026.

### TREE PLANTING

As with every year, you will see a number of street trees being planted throughout the Village this Fall. The trees were ordered and are entering their dormancy stage so once that occurs, we will plant them accordingly.

### SUTTON PARK WATER BOTTLE FILLER

We are still planning to move forward with our water bottle filler project in the next 30 days or so. This project has endured delays over the past months; however, in partnership with KAL, we will be installing new underground water infrastructure to prepare for its installation.
