New Business:

VSB 2025-40 Truth in Taxation Hearing

The public hearing was called to order. Lutke stated that the Village of Suttons Bay council is holding this truth in taxation hearing to hear public comments on the subject of the property tax millage rate proposed to be levied to support the proposed 2026 budget. The 2026 millage rates have not been set by the County however; the Village intends to assess the maximum millage allowed by Headlee.

No comments were received and the public hearing closed at 8:35 am.

Yoder moved Bahle seconded, CARRIED that the maximum millage rate allowed by Headlee to support the 2026 budget as provided for in Report VSB-2025-40 and being made part of this motion be adopted. Roll Call Vote: Smith-Yes, Christensen-Yes, Suppes-Yes, Bahle-Yes, Perkins-Yes, Yoder-Yes and Lutke-Yes. Ayes: 7 No: 0.

VSB-2025-38 2026 Budget and Schedule of Fees

Rob stated that the marina will see an increase in fees in 2026 and the following year. The water fees are also set to increase as recommended by the Utility Department. Perkins stated he did not feel local residents should have to pay the boat launch fee.

Motion by Yoder, seconded by Bahle CARRIED to adopt Resolution 3 of 2025, approving the 2026 Budget with revenues in the amount of \$3,369,360 and Expenditures in the amount of \$4,000,987 to support the 2026 Budget and Fee Schedule as described in Report VSB-2025-38 and being made part of the motion. Roll Call Vote: Smith-Yes, Christensen-Yes, Suppes-Yes, Bahle-Yes, Perkins-No, Yoder-Yes and Lutke-Yes. Ayes: 6 No: 1.

2026 Meeting Dates and Times

It was noted that there is no meeting in January. Yoder moved, Lutke seconded, CARRIED to approve the 2026 meeting dates as presented. Ayes: 7 No: 0.

Appointments, Committees, Boards and Commissions:

President Lutke recommended that Gail Hetler and Steve Feringa be reappointed to the Planning Commission and Karen Hassevoort reappointed to the Zoning Board of Appeals.

Moved by Yoder, seconded by Smith, CARRIED to re-appoint Gail Hetler and Steve Feringa to the Planning Commission for a three (3) year term through December 31, 2028 and Karen Hassevoort reappointed to the Zoning Board of Appeals for a three (3) year term ending December 31, 2028. Ayes: 7, No: 0.

Lutke appointed Trustees Christensen and Yoder to the Administrative Committee; Trustees Suppes and Smith to the Utilities Committee and Trustees Bahle and Perkins to the General Services Committee. Trustee Christensen was recommended for President Pro-Tem and Karl Bahle for the Zoning Board of Appeals.

Moved by Lutke, seconded by Suppes, CARRIED to approved the following appointments: Trustees Christensen and Yoder to the Administrative Committee; Trustees Suppes and Smith to the Utilities Committee and Trustees Bahle and Perkins to the General Services Committee. Trustee Christensen for President Pro-Tem and Karl Bahle for the Zoning Board of Appeals. Yes: 7 No: 0

ORDINANCE NO. Z-2026-01 (AMENDMENT 18 OF ORDINANCE 2 OF 2018)

**AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE ZONING ORDINANCE FOR THE VILLAGE OF
SUTTONS BAY**

At a regular meeting of the Village Council for the Village of Suttons Bay, Leelanau County, Michigan, held on February 17, 2026, beginning at 5:30 p.m., the following Ordinance was offered for adoption by Council Member _____ and was seconded by Council Member _____:

THE VILLAGE OF SUTTONS BAY ORDAINS:

To amend Section 1. Amendment of Article 2 is hereby amended as follows:

Article 2-3 Accessory Buildings:

Add:

C. EVSE Stations. EVSE stations are an allowed accessory use for all principal land uses and shall not require a permit for residential uses. Any EVSE spaces installed voluntarily as accessory uses shall comply with the standards of Section 10-10.

Section 2. Amendment of Article 10

Article 10: Off-Street Parking and Loading is hereby amended as follows:

Section 10-10 Electric Vehicle Charging Stations

A. Applicability. The requirements of this section apply to the installation of EVSE within the Village.

B. Design and Location.

1. EVSE equipment shall meet all parking setback and screening requirements.
2. EVSE spaces shall be clearly designated with signage and pavement markings.
3. EVSE spaces shall be sited in a manner that provides convenient pedestrian access to the principal use, comparable to other customer/visitor parking spaces.
4. Where possible, EVSE spaces shall be integrated into well-lit, visible areas of the parking lot.
5. Charging equipment shall be mounted on a permanent foundation or wall, shall not obstruct pedestrian circulation, and shall not reduce the minimum required width of accessible routes.

Section 3. Amendment of Article 20

Article 20: Definitions, Section 20-4 Definitions: D-E is hereby amended as follows:

Electric Vehicle Charging Station (EVSE): An accessory use that is a public or private parking space that is served by battery charging equipment for the purpose of transferring electric energy to a battery or other energy storage device in an electric vehicle. An EVSE space includes all required equipment, protective devices, and signage.

Section 2. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall become effective upon the expiration of seven (7) days after publication in the manner and as provided by law. A copy of the Zoning Ordinance is available at the Village Hall or on the Village website at www.suttonsbayvillage.org.

Larry Mawby encouraged the planning commission to recommend to the Village Council to adopt the language as presented.

Public hearing closed at 5:06 p.m. hearing no further comment.

The planning commission reviewed the criteria of Article 18-3 as it applies to the proposed Ordinance.

1. The proposed text amendment would clarify the intent of the ordinance.
The proposed text amendment is not clarifying the of the ordinance but is supported by the intent of the ordinance
2. The proposed text amendment would correct an error or oversight in the ordinance.
The amendment is not correcting an error; this is a new use that needed ordinance language to clarify the regulation
3. The proposed text amendment would address changes to the State legislation, recent case law or opinions from the Attorney General of the State of Michigan.
The amendment is clarifying regulations for a newer use that is permitted in the State. This amendment is not addressing any changes from the State.
4. The proposed text amendment would promote compliance with changes in other County, State or Federal regulations.
The proposed text amendment is not necessary for compliance with changes to other regulations. This amendment is clarifying a new type of use that is allowed.
5. In the event the amendment will add a use to a district, that use shall be fully consistent with the intent of the district and the character of the range of uses provided for within the district.
The amendment is adding an accessory use to the ordinance, it is consistent with the intent of the districts since it allows for electric vehicle charging where current or proposed parking is allowed. Parking is currently allowed in all districts; this expands the availability of electric vehicles with regulations specific to charging stations. The amendment will not create incompatible land uses within a zoning district, or between adjacent districts.
6. The amendment will not create incompatible land uses within a zoning district, or between adjacent districts.

This amendment does not create incompatible land uses. It is adding regulations for a use that is already taking place.

7. The proposed text amendment is supported by the findings of reports, studies, or other documentation on functional requirements, contemporary building practices, environmental requirements and similar technical items.

The text amendment is not supported by any special studies. The requirements are based on typical requirements for newer land uses in zoning. The master plan discusses electric charging and adding the language helps to move the master plan forward

8. As applicable, the proposed change shall be consistent with the Village's ability to provide adequate public facilities and services.

The text amendment will have no impact on public facilities and services available as an accessory use. They are currently allowed as an accessory structure; this language clarifies additional requirements specific to charging stations.

9. The proposed change shall be consistent with the Village's desire to protect the public health, safety, and welfare of the community.

The proposed language is consistent with the public health, safety and welfare and supported by the adopted Master Plan.

F. Smith moved, M. Campbell seconded, CARRIED to recommend the Village Council adopt the language as presented. Ayes: 5 Nays: 0 Motion Carried.

1. ZBA approval of a variance for build-to/setback along Dame Street. Nothing in the Planning Commission approval shall guarantee approval or action by the ZBA.
2. All outside agency permits shall be required. Approval of the site plan does not guarantee that outside permits will be approved or permitted as currently proposed. This includes but is not limited to: water, sewer, stormwater, roads, fire soil erosion, EGLE.
3. Approval of the site plan by fire and DPW for removal of secondary access to the site.
