Request to be placed on August 18th Village Council Meeting.

1. There is a need for at least 2 more stop signs on St Marys Street. The VOLUME of traffic has significantly increased during the past 5 years due to many using St Marys as a bypass from M 22. Locals and others no longer want to drive through downtown because they do not want to stop for pedestrian traffic or deal with the traffic congestion. And, of course, speeding has also become an issue. St Marys is a residential street & was never meant to be a highway bypass.

Village Manager, Rob Larrea, whom I contacted about this request in September of 2024, stated that a traffic study would need to be performed and stated that a study is not likely to justify additional stop signs. What is the date of the last "study" completed?

- 2. Council giving permits to use motorized vehicles on Village beaches.
- 3. The addition of at least 2 more handicap parking spaces at the Marina's parking for beach access. At this time there is only one handicap parking space.
- 4. When a Village ordinance is violated by a residence or business is there a means in place for follow up?

PURPOSE

To review and consider a request made by Grand Traverse Distillery, LLC 321 St Joseph Street, Unit A for an Off-Premise Tasting Room Permit.

OVERVIEW

A request has been made by Grand Traverse Distillery, to review and consider the attached Resolution. The State of Michigan requires government agencies to adopt a resolution for a recommendation from the local legislative body on applications associated with a premise requesting to serve alcohol. The applicant is requesting consideration of an **off-premise tasting room license** at the above-mentioned property location.

The process requires any municipality to first determine if the use is permitted, which is the step before you. The Applicant will then be required to apply to the State before moving forward. Once that step has been exhausted, the Applicant will then be required to apply to the Village and all permitting agencies with jurisdiction.

As you can see, this is not an efficient process but one determined by the State to protect the businesses, residents and municipalities. Staff has reviewed the zoning ordinance and has determined that the use itself is permitted. For clarification purposes, this approval is a recommendation to the State and not an approval of the project or business itself.

Manager's Evaluations:

President Lutke stated he had provided each council member with a copy of the manager's evaluation. He stated that the manager's evaluation ranked between 86% and 100% meeting expectation.

Lutke stated that the contract states the manager qualifies for an annual bonus. It was noted that the contract did not provide for a COLA increase. Lutke noted that this year's COLA is 2.5%. He stated a COLA would increase his salary by \$2875.00. After discussion, committee felt a bonus in the amount of \$3000 would be justified but to also factor in a COLA, bringing the amount to \$5875.00.

Committee stated that they would rather amend the contract to provide for a COLA increase and each year look at a bonus amount, based on the evaluations and other factors.

Committee recommends that the contract be amended to provide for a cost-of-living increase that is based on COLA.
